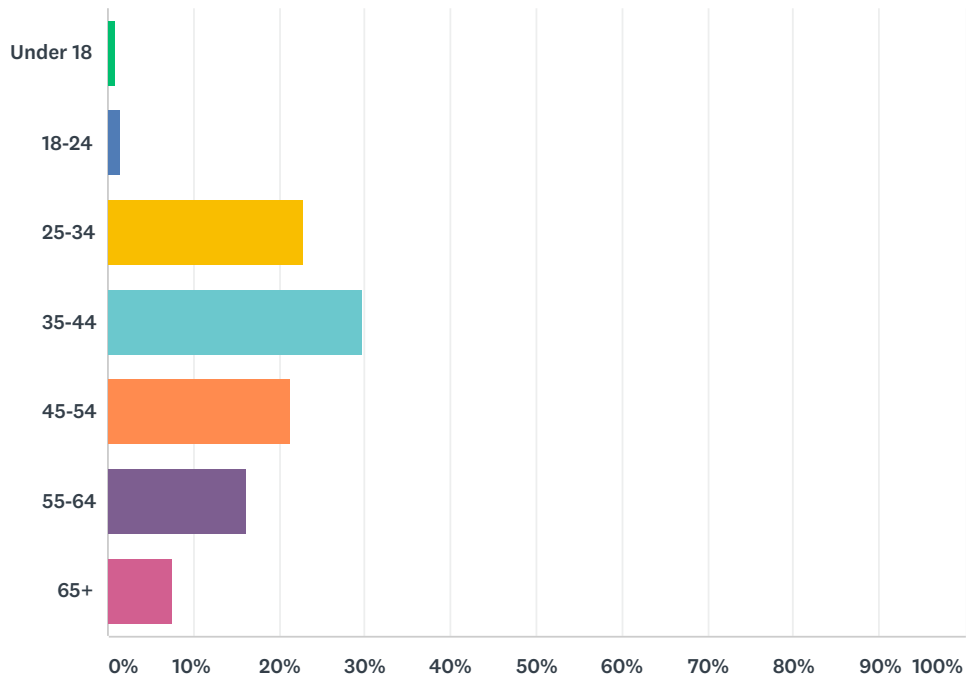

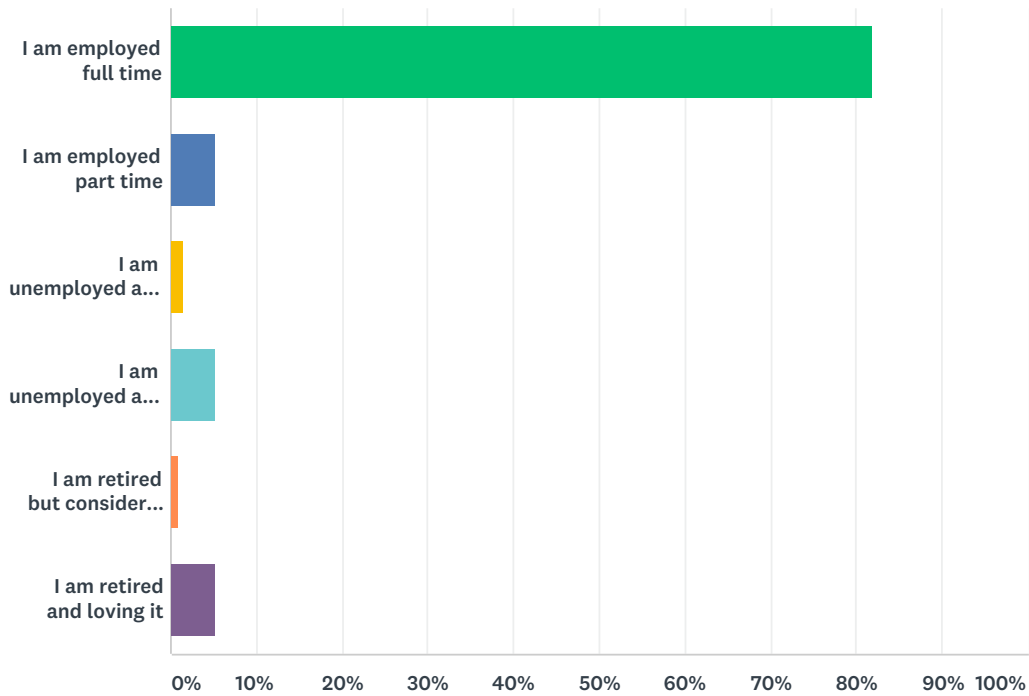

Q21 What is your current employment status?

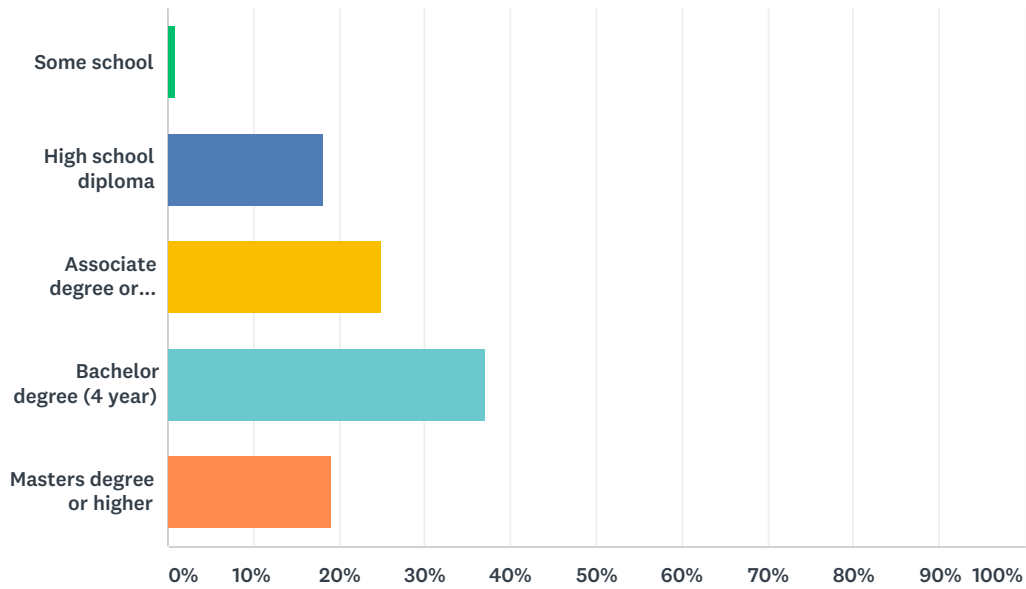

Q22 What is your highest level of education?

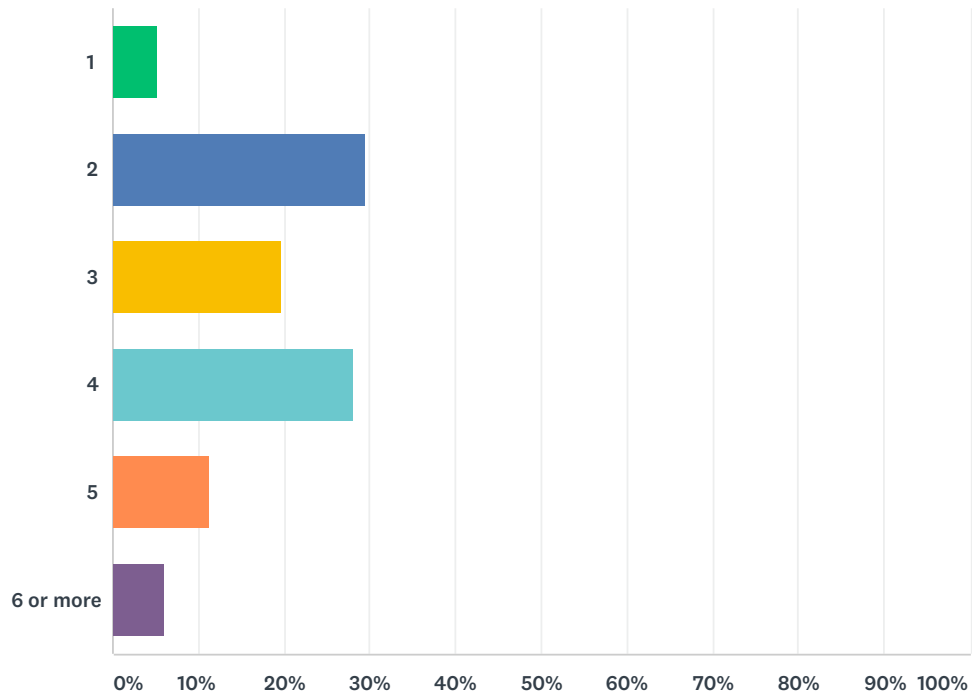

Q23 How many people are currently living in your household?

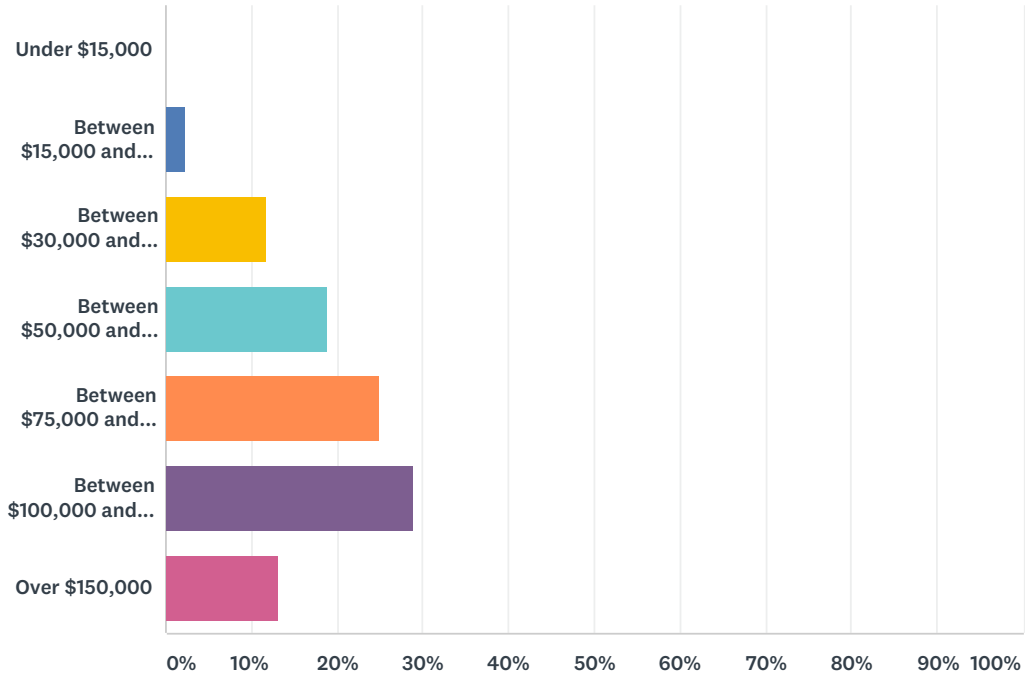

Q24 What is your approximate household income?

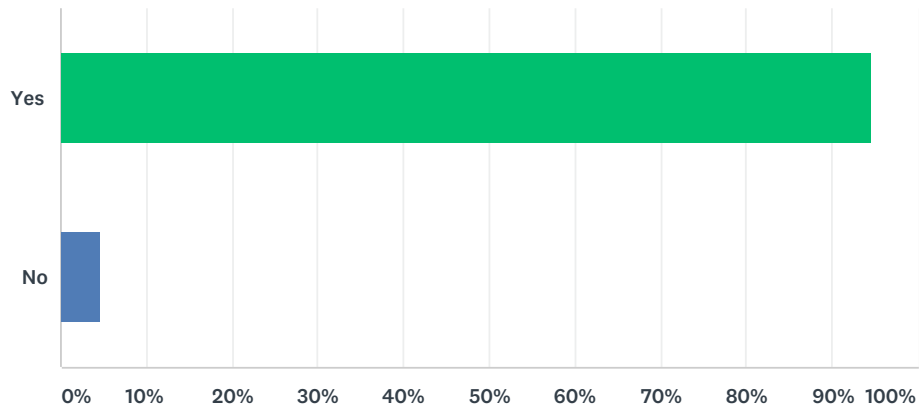

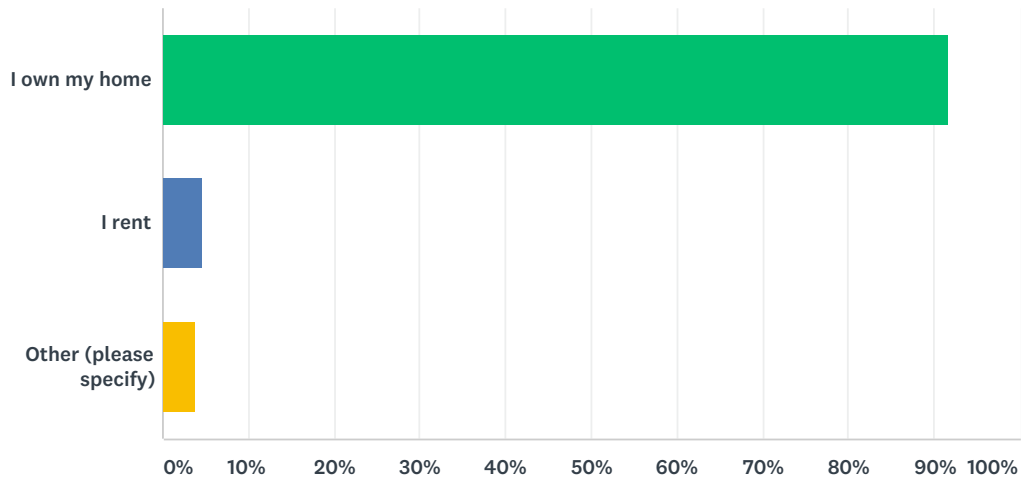

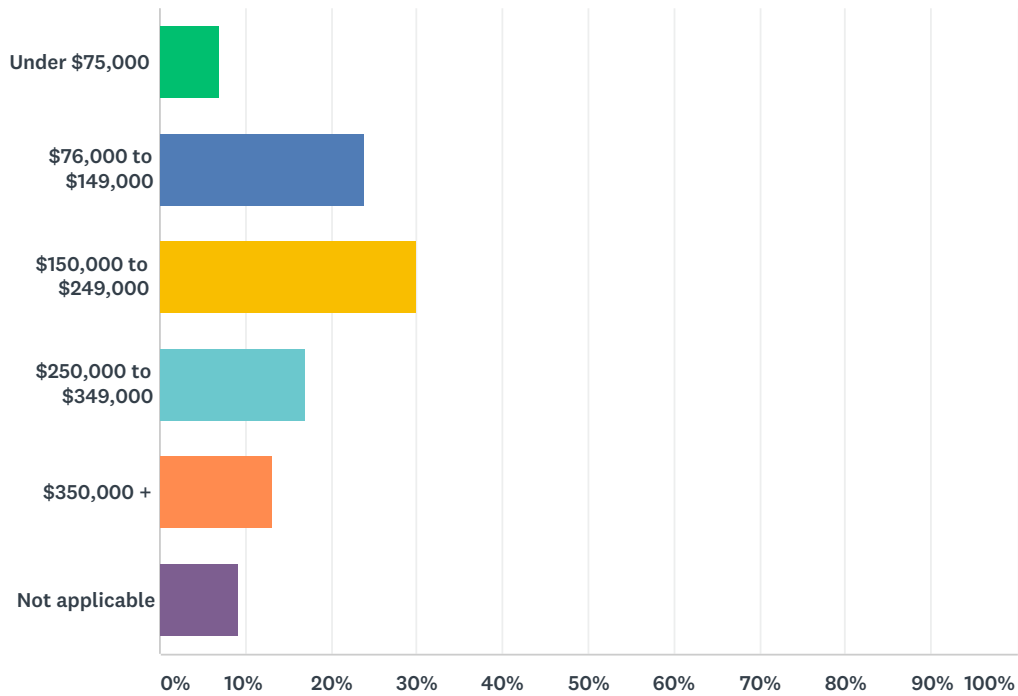

Q28 If you currently own, what is the approximate value of your home?

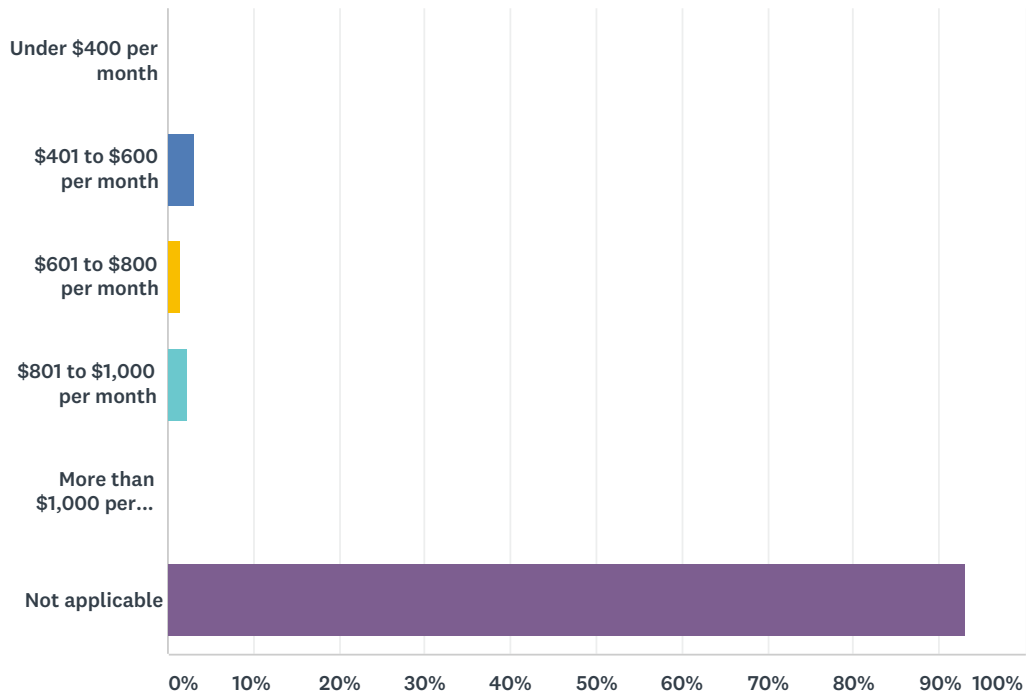

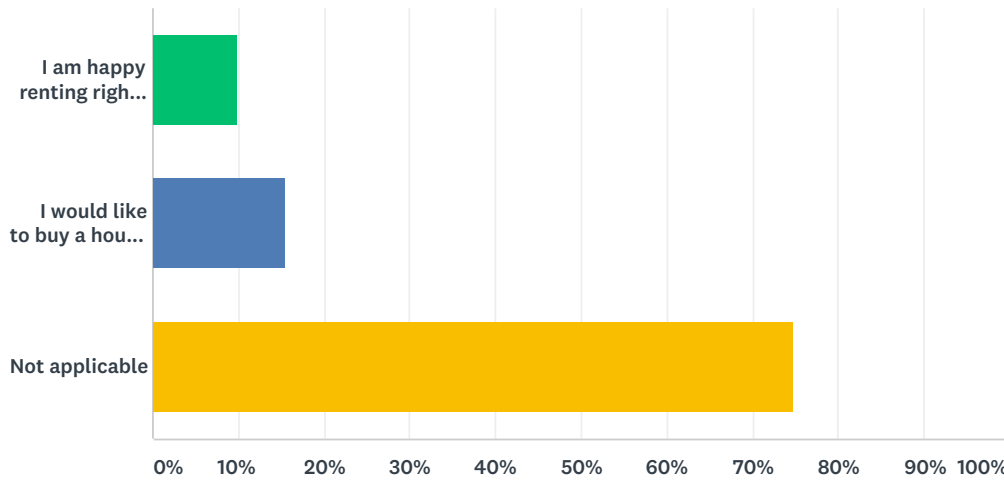

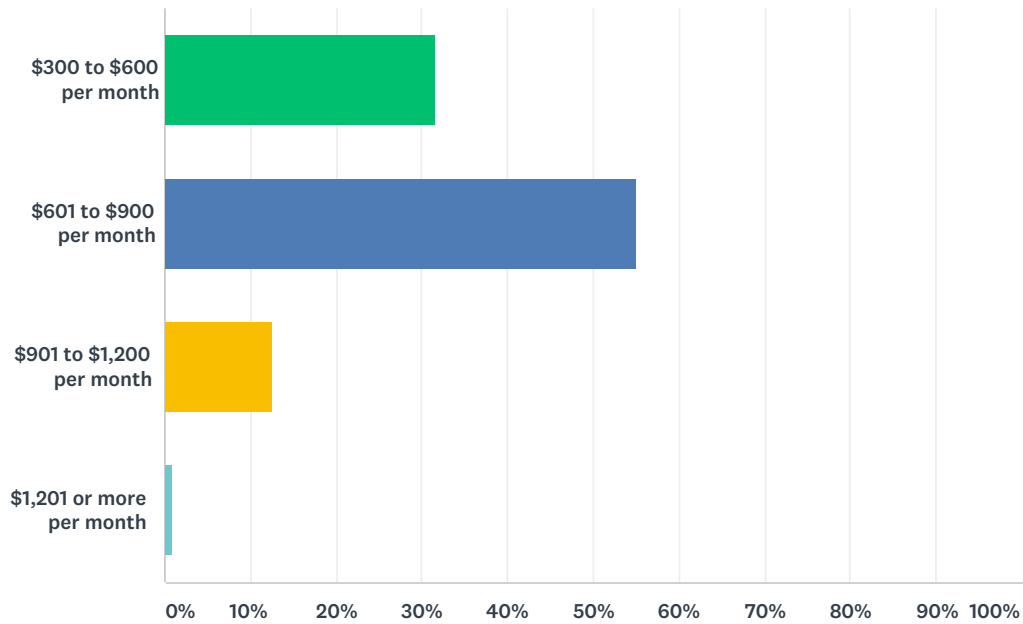

Q31 In YOUR OPINION - what is a reasonable price to pay to rent a place to live?

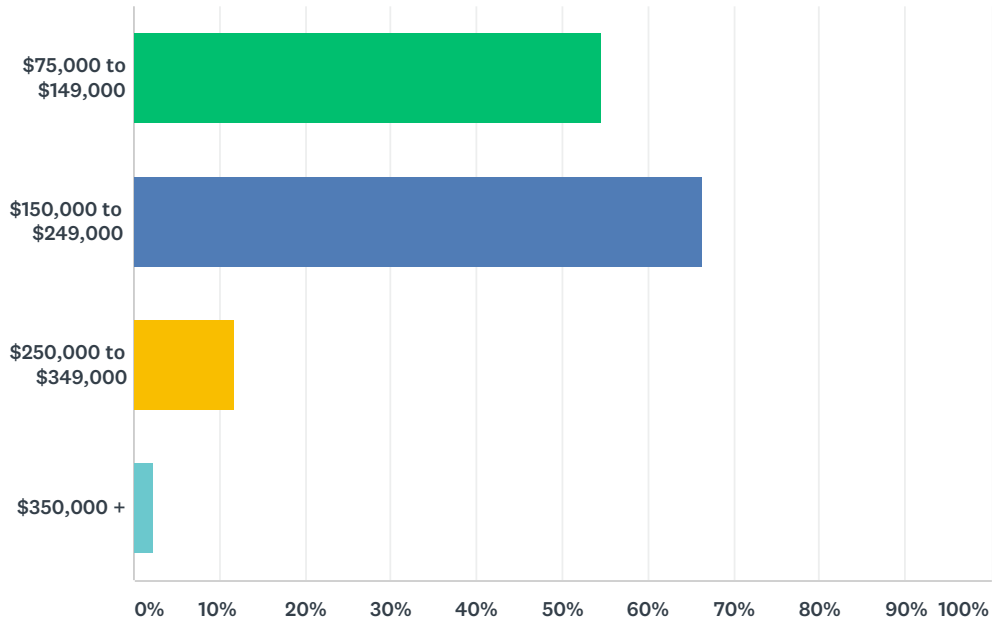

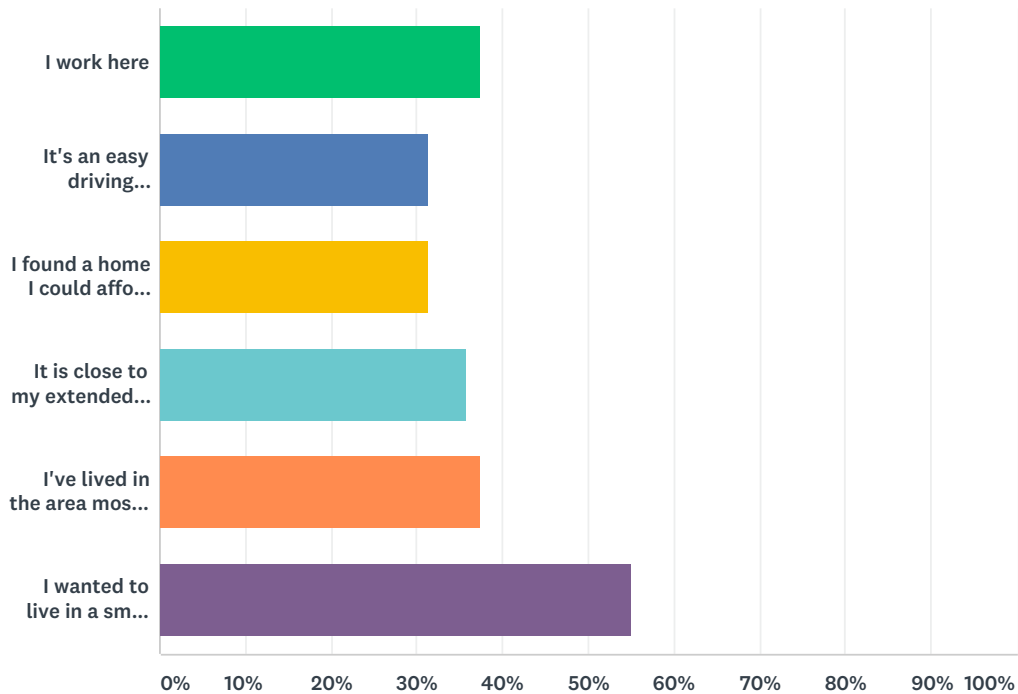

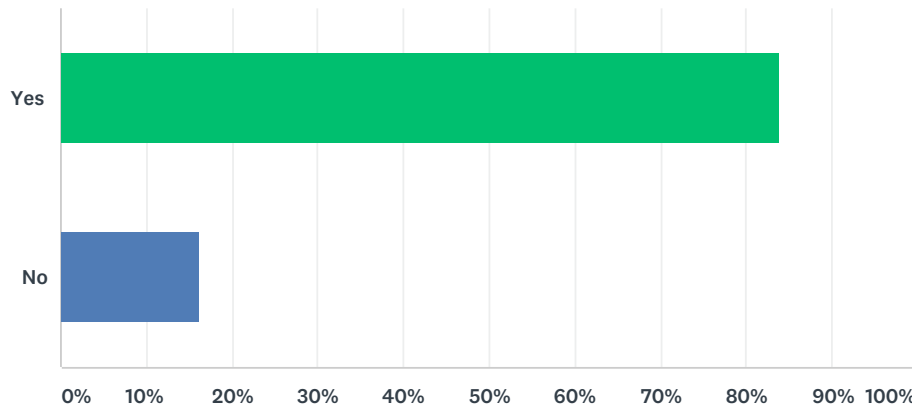

Q37 Would you attend a community education course on a topic that interests you?

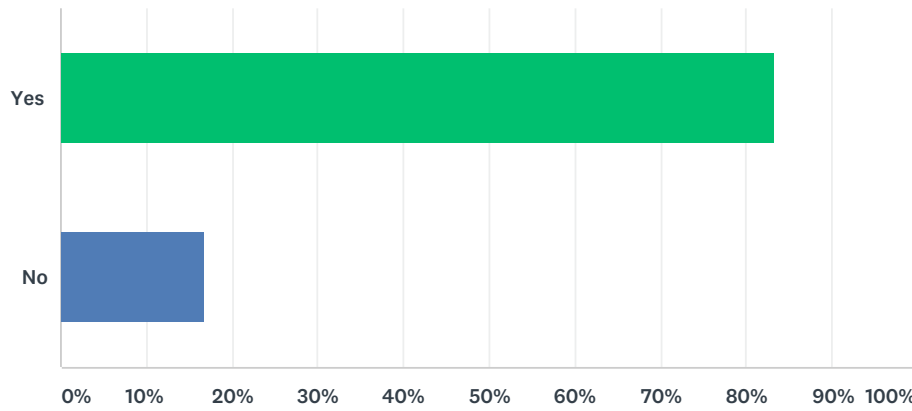

Q38 Would you pay a nominal fee depending on the cost of supplies/instructor fee for a community education course?

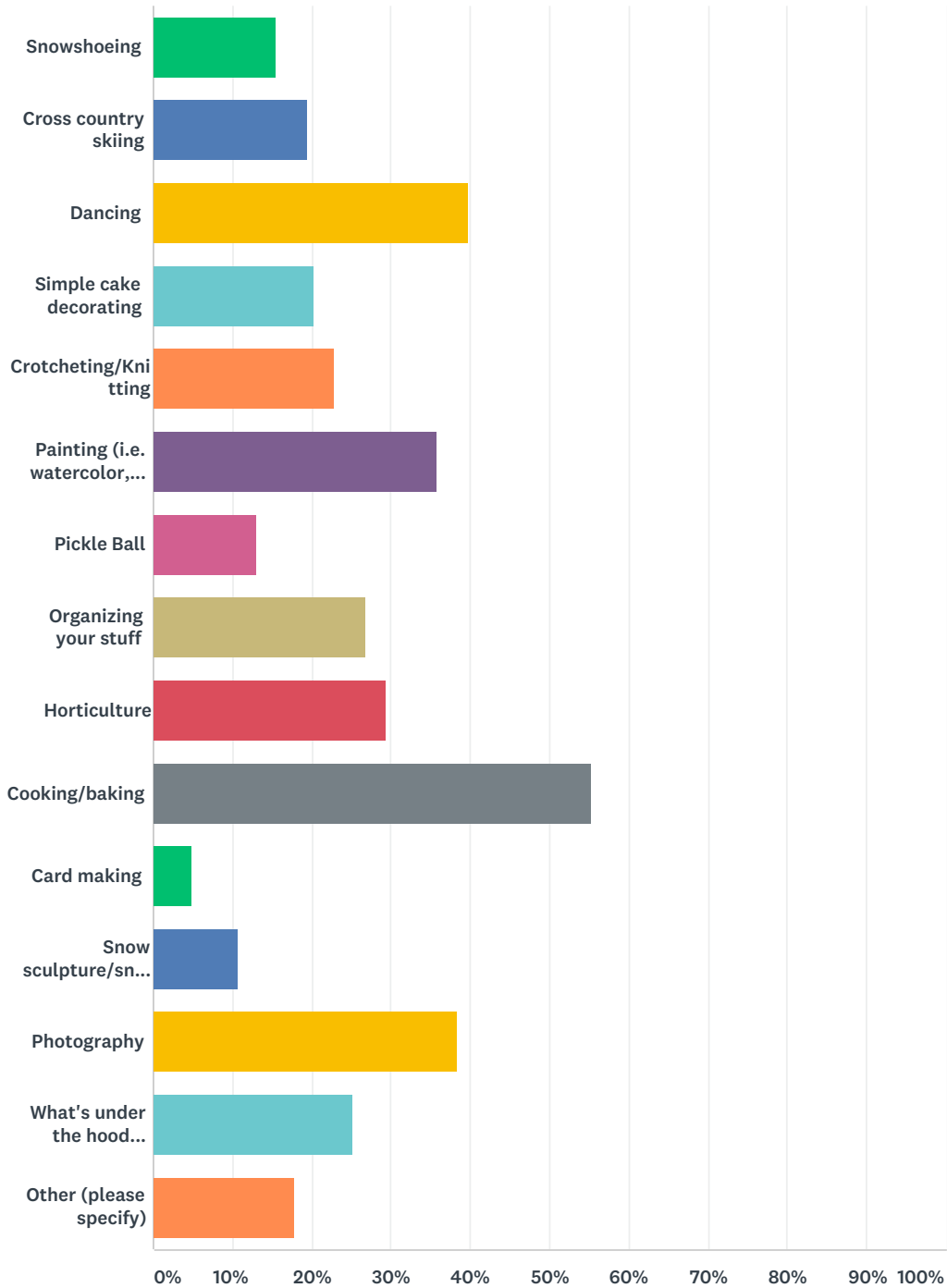

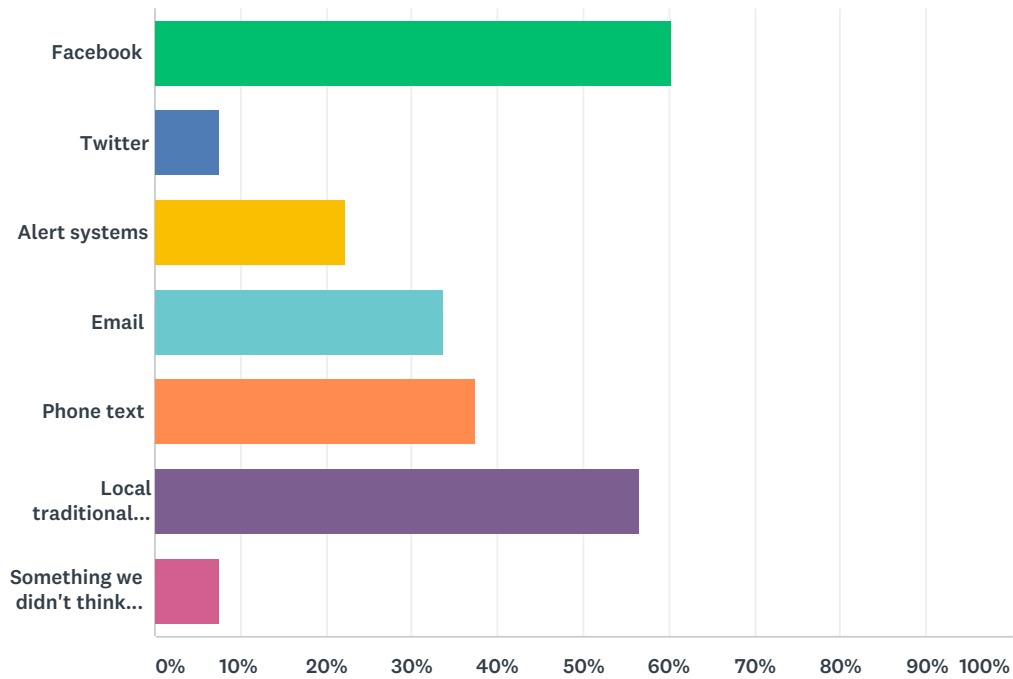

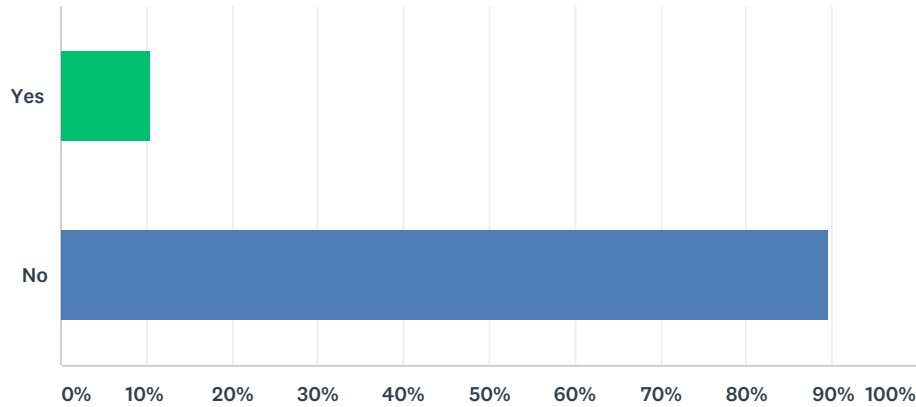

This city commission is leading us down a dark hole with little regard to budget, planning (the random strategic plan is frightening!) and inexperienced leaders. If the city had done their homework when hiring the new auditor, they would have found MANY issues with this man. He's a horrible welcome to our community.
